Prize

Prizes are awarded in both categories. In the Scientific Drawing category, the first prize is \in 500, the second prize is \notin 200, and the third prize is \notin 100. In the Nature Drawing category, the first prize is \notin 250, the second prize is \notin 100, and the third prize is \notin 50.
