The competition offers a unique opportunity for enthusiasts to have their photographs exhibited widely, providing a platform to educate and engage audiences with the vital importance of environmental protection and sustainability.

This prestigious contest is part of the Royal Society of Biology's broader mission to promote a deeper public understanding of biology and its critical role in addressing contemporary global challenges. By participating, amateur photographers not only contribute visually stunning images but also support advocacy efforts aimed at driving awareness and action around biodiversity loss and habitat destruction. The competition emphasizes that photography is more than just an artistic endeavor—it is a powerful educational tool capable of influencing perceptions, inspiring dialogue, and catalyzing change in the quest for a more sustainable and ecologically vibrant planet.

Eligibility

Open worldwide to amateur photographers; entrants must not be professional photographers, defined as those who make more than half their annual income from photography-related work

Prize

The Photographer of the Year (18 and over) will receive £1,000, while the Young Photographer of the Year (under 18) will receive £500.
