The Taylor Wessing Photographic Portrait Prize not only provides a platform for the world's most exciting and innovative portrait photography but also acts as a crucible for emerging talent, offering significant exposure and the opportunity to be featured alongside the best in the field. Its significance extends beyond the realm of photography, serving as a mirror to the societal, cultural, and personal narratives that shape our world. As such, the Prize is a highlight on the international art calendar, attracting entries from across the globe and drawing visitors to London to experience this showcase of human stories, captured through the photographer's eye.

The entry fee for the competition is £22 per image, but there are provisions for free entries for photographers on Universal Credit or Pension Credit, and discounts for those on Disability Benefits, students, or photographers aged between 18 and 25.

Eligibility

Open to everyone aged 18 and over from around the world.

Prize

The winner will receive £15,000, the second prize is £3,000, and the third prize is £2,000.
