There is a reduced entry fee for entries received before midnight on July 1st.

Eligibility

Entries must have been published or broadcast for the first time in the UK between 1 August 2014 and 31 July 2015

Prize

The **winners** of the *Media Awards* will be announced at a ceremony at London's BFI on *November 11, 2015*. Winners will be announced in all official categories.
