Moreover, the European Wildlife Photographer of the Year competition is a key event for raising awareness about environmental and conservation issues. Through the powerful medium of photography, it highlights the critical importance of preserving our natural world for future generations. The visibility provided by the competition, amplified by exhibitions, social media, and an extensive press campaign, extends the reach of these impactful images, making it an important date in the calendar for photographers keen on making a difference through their art. The entry fee is €35, but entry is free for the Youth category.

Open to photographers living in Europe.

## Prize

The prizes for the competition include €3,000 for the European Wildlife Photographer of the Year, €2,000 for the Fritz Pölking Prize, €1,500 and a merchandise voucher worth €500 for the Fritz Pölking Junior Prize, and €1,000 for the Rewilding Europe Award. Category winners (1-8) will receive €800 for first place and €500 for second place. In the Youth category, the first place winner will receive €200, and the second place winner will get €100. All winning participants will be invited to the award ceremony, receive free tickets to the GDT International Nature Photography Festival 2024 in Lünen, a certificate, and the exhibition catalogue.
