Science without Borders Challenge is an international art competition that engages students to promote the need to preserve, protect, and restore the world's oceans and aquatic resources.

Science without Borders Challenge was created to get students and teachers more involved and interested in ocean conservation through various forms of art. This yearly contest inspires students to be creative while using different types of media to promote public awareness of important ocean conservation issues.

This year's theme is "Connected Ocean: No Barriers, No Boundaries, and No Borders". There are no barriers, boundaries, or borders in the ocean, and although we often list the oceans separately, they are all interconnected to each other, forming one global ocean. For this year's contest, use your artistic talents to create a piece of artwork that illustrates how the ocean is connected.

Works will be judged in two categories:

• 11–14 year-olds • 15–19 year-olds

There is no minimum or maximum size requirements for the artwork. Acceptable media includes **paint**, **pencil**, **marker**, **crayon**, **ink**, and **chalk**. All submissions must be made by an individual artist. Group submissions are not permitted.

There is no entry fee.
