Each entry presents an opportunity for photographers to creatively interpret and document the relationship between weather, climate, and human experiences, inspiring both fascination and reflection among global audiences.

The competition also emphasizes inclusivity and innovation by offering distinct categories, such as the Main Category for traditional high-resolution photography, a dedicated Mobile Category for images captured on smartphones, a Young Weather Photographer category designed specifically for budding talents under the age of 18, and the specialized Standard Chartered Climate Award recognizing photographs with powerful narratives about climate-related challenges and solutions. Winners receive substantial cash prizes and international recognition, making this event highly attractive for those looking to enhance their visibility and reputation within the photography and environmental communities. The annual announcement of winners and featured imagery consistently garners widespread media coverage and engages millions through exhibitions, online galleries, and global promotional efforts.

Eligibility

Open to professional and amateur photographers of all ages and nationalities, with specific age requirements for the Young Weather Photographer category.

Prize

A total of £9,250 in cash prizes will be awarded across four categories: the Main Category winner will receive £5,000; the Mobile Category winner will receive £2,500; the Young Weather Photographer (under 18) will receive £750; and the Standard Chartered Climate Award winner will receive £1,000.
