Participating in YEATCA not only boosts visibility for the artists but also provides invaluable professional opportunities, such as curatorial mentorship, extensive media exposure, and the chance to produce a fully funded solo exhibition in Trieste. Winners benefit from dedicated curatorial support, receive coverage of travel and accommodation expenses, and have their work documented in a professionally published catalogue. This comprehensive approach ensures that young artists receive meaningful support at a pivotal stage of their careers, helping to solidify their presence and reputation within the competitive landscape of contemporary European art.

Eligibility

Artists born after 25 May 1995 in Albania, Austria, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Kosovo, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Turkey, and Ukraine.

Prize

The winner will be invited to plan a solo exhibition at Studio Tommaseo in Trieste, opening in December 2025. The exhibition production budget includes curatorial support, publication of an exhibition catalogue, and coverage of travel and accommodation expenses for the artist to attend the installation and opening.
